Printing in Golisano Library

Golisano Library has many printers available for patron usage. All printers are set by default to print double-sided to save paper. Although most printing is free at the library we strive to be environmentally conscious.

- **Moe: The Library Work Horse:** Located near the Resource Desk, the main printer/copier in the Information Commons. This machine can also copy (10 cents/copy) and scan (free).
- **Gaston: Be Our Guest:** The other main printer in the Information Commons. Gaston is located at the Research Consultation Desk in the middle of the first floor.
- **Eagle: Has landed upstairs!** Another printer/copier located near the elevator on the 2nd floor. Eagle scans in color!
- **Additional printers are located in the 24-hour Computer Lab and the Graduate Research Room**
- **Color printing is available at the Resource Desk and in the Curriculum Center and cost \$.25 per page.**

ProQuest!



Here at the B. Thomas Golisano Library we provide access to many different types of databases from a variety of vendors. One of the vendors is ProQuest. The ProQuest Research Library is one of our multidisciplinary databases which means that it contains articles from many different subject areas. It contains over 5,000 titles with 3,500 of those available in full text. It covers subjects such as arts, business, education, and health to name just a few. ProQuest Research Library is a great place to start your research and is easy to search and use.

U.S. Department of Education Resources Information Center (ERIC)



ERIC was created by the U.S. Department of Education as a repository for education research to be accessed by the public. There are two paths that Golisano Library users can navigate to access ERIC:

- 1.) EBSCO (the database vendor) version can be accessed through the Library's homepage, by choosing Education in the Electronic Resources drop-down menu. Because this is accessed through the Library, links will be provided to the full text of articles in other databases if they are not available in ERIC.
- 2.) The Department of Education hosts the repository at <http://eric.ed.gov/>. The Department of Education ERIC is a great resource for students once they graduate and are no longer affiliated with the school and our library resources. They can access the Department of Education website at no charge and find links to full text articles.
